

New aerodrome rules are now in effect

Accountable Manager

Under the new rules there is a requirement to appoint an Accountable Manager. All operators of existing aerodromes should have a senior manager who currently has overarching responsibility for the regulatory compliance, operation and maintenance of their aerodrome. Whilst the requirement to have an Accountable Manager takes effect on the date of commencement, a formal record of the position in the aerodrome manual is not required until the revised or new manual is submitted to CASA.

Aerodrome pavements are critical to the safe, efficient and economic operation of the aerodrome. To ensure that hazards to aircraft are minimised they must be constructed and maintained in a suitable condition for the particular demands of the intended aircraft operations.
